
The last port stop for this month was the LVRF breakfast. This was a great event and to see the entire donation being given is once again truly humbling for me as the district governor.

#### Dear Lions,

Disasters strike all over the world, seemingly every day. Sometimes, significant disasters occur in different areas all at once. During times like this, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) is able to offer support to local Lions Clubs for their disaster relief work.

In the past few weeks, several of our constitutional areas have experienced devastating tragedy. Catastrophic floods are overwhelming the central United States and parts of Mozambique, Malawi, and Zimbabwe.

In the US, hundreds of levees were breached and entire towns have been destroyed. The land and the farmers whose livelihood depends on it are devastated. In Nebraska alone, livestock and crops losses are expected to reach \$1 billion. It will likely take years to recover from this disaster.

In the days immediately following the disaster, LCIF awarded five Emergency grants totaling US\$50,000. The gravity of the situation has become more apparent, and your foundation has responded with another US\$50,000 Major Catastrophe grant for all affected regions.

In Mozambique, Malawi, and Zimbabwe, thousands of people are missing in the wake of Cyclone Idai. The death toll cannot even be estimated right now. Residents of these countries are in dire need of food, water, medical supplies, shelter and sanitation.

To assist local Lions in their relief efforts, LCIF initially awarded two US\$10,000 Emergency grants. As the devastating effects of this disaster have become more apparent, your Foundation has responded again with a US\$50,000 Major Catastrophe grant for the affected countries.

We are only able to offer this assistance because of your generous support. Your donations to LCIF's disaster relief fund enable us to provide Lions with the tools they need to help those who need us most.





# Dr. Denis Mukwege to receive Lion Humanitarian Award



Dr. Denis Mukwege is a world-renowned gynecologist, human rights activist and Nobel Peace laureate from east Congo. He has become the world's leading specialist in the treatment of wartime sexual violence and a global campaigner against the use of rape as a weapon of war. Due to the high level of sexual violence in the region amid a war that has shaken east Congo for more than two decades, Dr. Mukwege specialized in providing care for women affected during the conflict.

As a child, Dr. Mukwege accompanied his father, a pastor, to visit the sick in Bukavu, a city in the eastern part of the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) on the shore of Lake Kivu. One day, they went to see a terminally-ill boy. They prayed for him but were unable to do more. Mukwege was eight years old at that time and decided after this experience that he would become a doctor, telling

his father: "You can pray, but I will give medicines."

For his many remarkable contributions to the protection and enrichment of human life and dignity, Lions Clubs International will present Dr. Mukwege with the Lions Humanitarian Award at LCICon 2019 in Milan, Italy. The award is our organization's highest honor, given to an individual or organization with exemplary humanitarian efforts.
