Hello Lions,

You may have seen the President at the Washington, DC Law Enforcement Memorial yesterday honoring the officers who's names are memorialized on the walls. We can also show our appreciation to the officers and the agencies that protect our community.

Peace Officers Memorial Day is held annually in the United States on May 15th in honor of federal, state and local officers killed or disabled in the *line of duty*. Since the year 1791 over 20,000 law enforcement personnel have made the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty. Many people go into law enforcement because of their feelings of a moral obligation to help others. They are sworn to keep us be safe 24 hrs. a day 7 days a week. The police job descriptions and duties are as long as your arm. They must have exemplary judgement and knowledge; be able to multitask and face impossible situations while keeping calm, fair and unbiased; they must be able to make split second decisions that could end a life. But, they go to work every day and they are there to answer your call.

We can place a blue light in your window to show support for the local law enforcement. You can also show appreciation by displaying blue ribbons which are a symbol of law enforcement support. Display your feelings with blue ribbons on your car, mail box, front porch or door. You can also honor their sacrifice by flying your flag at half mast. These are great gestures to support law enforcement but, please do one thing more that will make a bigger difference. Talk to your local officers and thank them personally.

Before this year the last Delaware police officer to die in the line of duty was New Castle County Lieutenant Joseph L. Szczerba on 9/16/11. In 2017 on 2/2/17 Delaware Department of Correction Lieutenant Steven Floyd and on 4/26/17 Delaware State Police Corporal Stephen J. Ballard was killed in the line of duty. Blue lives are precious and they do matter. Honor and remember their sacrifice and pray for them and the families that they left behind.

The Literacy Program at Frankford Public Library offers tutoring in Basic Reading and Writing, Math and Financial Literacy, English Language Learning and Civics Education.
